

POINTS TO PONDER

- The believer's authority is such a vital revelation that without it, you'll end up with a want-to with no power—exactly what we see in a lot of the church today.
- Jesus said in John 19:30, "*It is finished.*" Even today, many believers don't get it. They haven't seen that triumphal procession in their spirit. They missed the parade.
- Carlie Terradez says, "When the enemy is seeking whom he may devour, just take yourself off the menu."
- When God says, "Resist the enemy," it's because we have the ability, in God through Christ, to do it.
- You can't resist what you embrace. If you think sickness is some kind of gift from God to teach you something, how will you resist those symptoms and receive healing? You can't embrace a lie and call it truth.
- Be steadfast in your faith. Settle it in your heart before there is a storm. Take time to marinate in the Word of God and know that you know that you know that you know.
- You can't resist without first submitting yourself to God and all that He has provided for us in Christ.
- When you recognize that the enemy is trying to talk to you, resist him by not listening. You don't have to stand there and listen to all that junk, all those lies. Don't listen. Don't stay engaged in that conversation.
- The joy of the Lord is so powerful. If we only knew how powerful this relationship with Jesus really is, how powerful His life in us is right now. When we submit ourselves to God, of course the enemy will flee.
- Our strength in this life is our relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ through the presence of the Holy Spirit.
- God's armor, His life, His grace, and His provision is what I'm going to walk in on a daily basis. Prepare for battle by putting on the armor of God. Put on the finished works of Jesus. His victory is your victory.
- We need to cooperate with, embrace, and enforce the finished work of Jesus. But we have to know what we believe and be persuaded in our hearts. We have to understand that the truth that we're embracing is the truth that's setting us free. Standing against, withstanding, and resisting are not passive words.

- The Word of God will show us what we need to see. It cuts away what needs to be cut away. We can use the Word as both an offensive weapon and as a defensive weapon.
- In times of pressure, we often enter into temptation to do something in the flesh. We react to a situation and do something to try to fix it.
- The enemy will oppose the will of God in our lives by trying to get us to react to the circumstances instead of responding to the voice of God.
- In times of pressure, lies will often feel true. Even the facts will try to rise up and masquerade as truth. But just because it's a fact, just because it's real, doesn't make it true.
- If the abundance of your heart is filled with doubt and unbelief and you get under pressure, out from your heart will come a bunch of doubt and unbelief.
- Audrey Mack said, "Symptoms are to the body what temptation is to sin. Listen, just because those symptoms are roaming around in your neighborhood, you don't have to let them in."
- We need to get really good at minimizing the lie and really good at magnifying the truth.
- When we begin to say what God is saying, and we begin to speak to our mountain, we will see that mountain cast into the sea.
