1. Why is it important to address the “what abouts?” and areas where we have questions in the Bible?

Possible answer: It is important to address our questions because if we can find evidence of God refusing to heal someone or making someone sick, we have a reason to doubt His willingness to heal.

2. How does doubting God’s goodness, His desire to heal, and what redemption has accomplished affect your healing?

If we have doubts, faith in God for healing becomes difficult.

3. Why is the phrase, “The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away,” not something for New Covenant believers to say?

Possible answers: God is the giver of all good things (James 1:17), and it is the Enemy who steals, kills, and destroys (John 10:10); God doesn’t put sickness on anyone; He heals for His glory.

4. How are you different from Job?

New Covenant believers are different from Job because we have a covenant with God; we know about the Enemy and have spiritual weapons to fight against him; we have knowledge of God and the Bible; we are born again; we worship God in spirit and in truth; we do not live in fear; we have Jesus as our intercessor.

5. What is a thorn in the flesh?

A thorn in the flesh is a messenger of Satan, a demonic presence, that comes against a believer and tries to stop their ministry.

6. Do you think Paul had an eye issue? Explain your answer.

Possible answer: No. Paul never mentioned eye trouble in his list of afflictions. Eyes swollen shut could have been as a result of the beatings or stoning mentioned in his afflictions.

7. According to John 9:2-4, what do we learn about the cause of the man's blindness?

We learn that the man's blindness was not from God, but from living in a fallen world. It was his healing that brought glory to God.
