ANSWERS**

1. What is the *ecclesia*, and what is it “called out” to do?

***Ecclesia* is the Greek word for church, and we are to do the same works that Jesus did, including healing.**

2. What is significant to note about John 20:1–12 and Galatians 3:16?

**Jesus and His body became the Seed—through His death, burial and resurrection—that produced the body of Christ. Without Jesus dying and resurrecting again, there would never have been a body of Christ.**

3. What is the danger for today’s church if the church doesn’t stay knitted together (Eph. 4:11–16)?

**Possible answers: The church can’t function and stay healthy to do what Jesus commanded the church to do; it won’t grow; it might fall apart and be deceived by false doctrines.**

4. What were normal experiences for the New Testament church as they took Jesus’s power with them daily?

**The apostles, and ordinary believers, experienced miracles, healings, signs and wonders.**

5. According to John 14:12, what encouragement does Jesus give the church?

**Jesus tells the church that they will do the works He did and greater works.**

6. How would you explain to someone that healing didn’t pass away with the twelve Apostles?

**Possible answers: God has anointed, called, and equipped you to be able to do through the Word, and through the Spirit of God, everything that Jesus said that we would do; the church would have to pass away in order for healing to pass away; God didn’t only use apostles to heal, but also used ordinary believers to heal, such as Stephen, Philip, and Ananias.**
