1. Why is it important to note that 1 Thessalonians 5:23 refers to the spirit, soul, and body?

Possible answers: This verse shows there are three distinct parts of a person; some people mistakenly think the spirit and soul are the same thing; it is important to see that the spirit realm trumps the physical and emotional realms.

2. According to John 6:63, why are the words you speak important?

Possible answers: My words are spirit and life; I get what I speak; the Holy Spirit communicates life to me through God's Word, and I can speak out the same life-giving words to my body.

3. In Ephesians 1:15–18, what did Paul's prayer urge the Ephesians to recognize?

Paul wanted the Ephesians to see that they were not trying get anything from God and to recognize what God had already given them.

4. If you look into the mirror of God's Word in 1 Peter 2:24, what should you see?

I should see that I was healed by Jesus's stripes, and I should believe—over what I see in the physical and emotional realms—that healing is a done deal.

5. According to the scriptures used in this lesson, explain the process of what happens to your spirit, soul, and body when you accept Christ as your Savior.

Possible answer: Your spirit is new and perfect (2 Cor. 5:17), just like Jesus's. Your body and mind remain unchanged, but you have to renew your mind to think like Christ (Rom. 12:2).

6. After hearing the scriptures in today's lesson, what is your attitude about healing?

Possible answers: I'm starting from who I am and what I have in Christ. I'm not fighting to get healed; I'm fighting because I'm already healed.
