1. According to Psalm 78:41, what might contribute to a lack of healing?

**A person might tempt or limit God by unbelief or focus on symptoms rather than God's Word.**

2. What important insight does Luke 5:12-13 give about whether healing is God's will?

**Healing is God's will because Jesus told the leper, "I am willing" and then He healed the man.**

3. Why do you think Jesus didn't take offense at the leper?

**Possible answer: Jesus didn't take offense because He knew the leper didn't have a revelation of who He is and His nature.**

4. According to Luke 10:19, what does Jesus give you and what are you to do with it?

**Jesus gives me all of His authority and power to use over the Enemy.**

5. Using the examples in today's teaching of people healed by Jesus, what "work" did people do to contribute to their healings?

**The people had faith and believed.**

6. Why should you no longer question whether it is God's will to heal?

**Possible answers: Jesus is the express image of God and the exact representation of the Father, so whatever we see Jesus doing we know it is the will of the Father; Jesus told the leper He was willing to heal him; we are the seed of Abraham and we are to be free from anything that has us in bondage.**
